The Directors of Arif Habib Limited (AHL), are pleased to present the Directors' Report of the Company together with unaudited condensed interim financial statements for the nine months and third quarter period ended March 31, 2014.

Economy

In 9MFY14, all major macro economic indicators have improved and growth recovery appears to be in place. Higher foreign inflows, strong remittances receipts, lower inflation, appreciating PKR and a favorable discount rate have helped prosper business activity in the country.

As of the latest official figures published, Pakistan's fiscal deficit posted a figure of PKR 540bn (2.1% of the GDP) compared to PKR 624.6bn (or 2.6% of the GDP) in 1HFY13. Government revenue remained firm with tax collection totaling PKR 1.15tn against PKR 0.99tn in the corresponding period last year, an increase of 17% YoY. The government with realization of inflows under Pakistan Development Fund (PDF) worth USD 1.5bn and Euro Bond proceeds amounting to USD 2bn will help reduce borrowing requirement.

In addition, foreign inflows in the form of concessionary grants, unilateral & bilateral funding, improving remittances receipt (growth of 11%YoY to USD 10.8bn) has helped build up county's foreign exchange reserve which touched a low of USD 7.9bn in Jan-14 reaching USD 10bn by Mar-14. As a result PKR gained significantly against USD, appreciating by 7% since Dec - 13.

Average inflation of 8.6% during the period has remained subdued, and it is likely to remain below 9% for FY14. This is considerably lower than SBP's initial target of 10-11%. As a result, SBP eased monetary policy bringing it down to 10% from 11% in Jul-13.

Going forward we foresee PKR to remain stable against the USD, based on planned bilateral inflows, 3G/4G spectrum auction, incremental exports on account of GSP+ status by EU and Euro Bond issue in 4QFY14. In addition, monetary easing further down the road would help recover business and thus improve LSM, a key ingredient for sustainable economic growth.

Market

KSE-100 benchmark index continued its upward momentum during 9MFY14 posting a solid return of 29% (6,154 points) to end the period at 27,159 points with market capitalization increasing by USD 14.5bn to stand at USD 67.13bn at the period-end. Better foreign exchange reserves position, improving PKR, successful completion of IMF's quarterly

reviews and increase in Pakistan's weight in MSCI Frontier Market Index to 8.9% from 4.3%, were the major contributors toward this strong KSE performance.

During 9MFY14, Foreign Investors Portfolio Investment (FIPI) recorded a net inflow of USD 22.8mn as compared to USD 228mn during the same period last year. Though on a net basis, FIPI has shown a decline, however share of the market activity by the foreign investors have improved to 7% in 9MFY14 from 5% in the same period last year. Liquidity of the market improved by a 7% YoY to an average of 215mn shares per day, compared to 201mn shares exchanging hands in the same period last year. Similarly, average value traded recorded a 51% YoY growth to USD 108mn versus last year average value traded of USD 71mn.

Financial Performance

By the grace of Almighty Allah, your Company has continued to perform well and achieved healthy profitability during the nine month period of the fiscal year 2014. The Company has posted after tax profit of PKR 635.3mn(PKR 467.2mn) which translates into an EPS of PKR 11.55(PKR 8.49).

During the period under-review, all divisions supported to achieve revenue growth of 22%. The brokerage division has shown an outstanding growth as its revenue increased by 117% from last nine months results to PKR181.1mn (PKR83.5mn). The Corporate Finance income increase by 98% from last nine months results stood at PKR 37.8mn (PKR 19.1mn). The Company's investment portfolio has yielded healthy realized and unrealized revenue growth of 53% to PKR 644mn (PKR 420mn), compared to last nine month of the same period.

The administrative expenses for the period were reduced by 33% to PKR 122.5mn compared to PKR182.5mn in the corresponding last nine month period on account of controlling provisions. Our finance cost for the period increased by 26% to PKR185.7mn(PKR 136.5mn) as higher borrowings were deployed in the opportunistic investments' which have performed significantly well.

The equity of the Company has increased by 38% to PKR 1.8bn (June 2013: PKR.1.3bn) which translates into book value per share of PKR 33.34(June 30, 2013: PKR 24.42). The healthier equity level was achieved despite the release of PKR 150mn reserves for cash dividends approved in the AGM held on October 25, 2013.

Future Prospects

The future prospects of our company look positive on account of growing volumes and expected increase in our market share. We are targeting to generate higher brokerage revenue from foreign clients going forward as we strengthen our relationship with foreign fund managers and broker dealers. We are confident to improve our market share in local and international brokerage and from our money-market desk. We are engaged in potential equity and debt transactions which are likely to add to our earnings going forward.

1 STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

1.1 Arif Habib Limited (the Company) is a public listed Company incorporated in Pakistan under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. The shares of the Company are quoted on Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchanges of Pakistan. The Company was initially incorporated as an unquoted public limited Company wholly owned by Arif Habib Corporation Limited. (the Parent Company). Subsequently, the Parent Company offered its 25% share holding in the Company to general public and the Company obtained listing on the Karachi Stock Exchange Limited on January 31, 2007.

The Company is holder of Trading Right Entitlement Certificate (TREC) of Karachi, Lahore and Islamabad Stock Exchanges. The principal activities of the Company are Investments in a mix of listed and unlisted equity and debt securities and reverse repurchase transactions, share brokerage, Inter bank brokerage, Initial Public Offer (IPO) underwriting, advisory and consultancy services. The registered office of the Company is situated at Arif Habib Centre, 23 M.T. Khan Road, Karachi.

- 1.2 The Parent Company holds 69% shares of the Company.
- 1.3 The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan vide its letter No. EMD/233/683/2002-474 dated October 30, 2013 has granted exemption to the Company from preparation of the Consolidated Financial Statements.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

This condensed interim financial information of the Company for nine months period ended 31 March 2014 has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial reporting" and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance 1984. In case where requirements differ, the provisions of or directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 have been followed.

This condensed interim financial information is unaudited and is being submitted to the shareholders as required by Section 245 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984.

This condensed interim financial information does not include all the information required for full financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual audited separate financial statements as at and for the year ended 30 June 2013.

The comparative balance sheet presented in this condensed interim financial information has been extracted from the annual audited separate financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2013, whereas the comparative condensed interim Profit and Loss Account, condensed interim Statement of Comprehensive Income, condensed interim Cash Flow statement and condensed interim Statement of Changes in Equity are extracted from the unaudited condensed interim financial information for the period ended 31 March 2013.

This condensed interim financial information is presented in Pakistan Rupees which is also the Company's functional currency and all financial information presented has been rounded off to the nearest rupee.

This condensed interim financial information has been prepared on the basis of a single reportable segment.

2.2 Basis of measurement

This condensed interim financial information has been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for certain investment classified as at fair value through profit or loss and available for sale which are measured at fair value.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies and methods of computation adopted in the preparation of this condensed interim financial information are the same as those applied in the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2013.

Amendments to certain existing standards and new interpretation on approved accounting standards that become effective during the period either were not relevant to the Company's operations or did not have any significant impact on the accounting policies of the Company.

4 ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGMENTS

The preparation of the condensed interim financial information in conformity with approved accounting standards require management to make estimates, assumptions and use judgments that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses. Estimates, assumptions and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including reasonable expectations of future events. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized prospectively commencing from the period of revision.

In preparing the condensed interim financial information, the significant judgments made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and the key sources of estimation uncertainty were the same as those that applied to the preceding published annual financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended June 30, 2013.

5 PROPERTY, PLANT & EQUIPMENT

During the nine months period ended March 31, 2014, addition made amounting to Rs. 4.503 million (June 2013: 1.09 million) which comprised of leasehold improvement, office equipment, computer and allied and vehicles. Further, assets having WDV of Rs. 1.674 million were sold for Rs. 2.072 million (June 2013: WDV OF Rs. 0.521 million were sold of Rs. 0.788 million).
